Title	One Bromley Recovery Plan

Executive Summary	<p>The impact of the Covid19 pandemic has affected all aspects of life for those living and working in Bromley.</p> <p>The One Bromley recovery plan sets out the joint response for Health and Care services delivered through the One Bromley Local Care Partnership (LCP).</p> <p>The plan is one element of Borough wide recovery strategy led by the London Borough of Bromley and aligns with the wider objectives to support the overall recovery in all areas for residents and patients in the Borough.</p> <p>The One Bromley Recovery Plan covers many aspects to support a programme of work for the next 18 months and is divided into the following sections:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Introduction – The plan’s key focus is on recovery of services in Bromley, preparing for the winter including any potential further Covid-19 outbreaks and how these are feed into the wider transformation of services in Bromley over the coming months. The plan is part of the wider Bromley Borough recovery strategy and a South East London CCG / Integrated Care System (ICS) plan. It also complements the individual plans of members of the One Bromley LCP2. Population Health – The impact of Covid-19 on the population is described, with a focus on the impact on inequalities. The plan sets out Bromley will address these impacts and how this will inform the programme of work going forward3. Working Together – look at what the One Bromley response was in terms of the delivery of health and care in the Borough. It examines three case studies of services introduced during the period through One Bromley, importantly learning key lessons to inform the future transformation of services

	<p>4. Planning for Recovery – reviews previous priority areas and workstreams for One Bromley and sets out future delivery plans learning from the experience of the past few months. These include areas such as urgent care, frailty, children and young people’s services and mental health setting out key priorities and milestones for the next 18 months</p> <p>5. Link to wider system plans – sets out how the One Bromley Plan sits alongside and complements the wider Borough wide plans and workstreams. It also works together with the wider South East London ICS plan and One Bromley LCP partners’ plans. This section also information of the financial impact of the pandemic.</p> <p>6. Infrastructure – focuses on the infrastructure programme and key workstreams. It sets out how One Bromley will jointly progress its plan around areas such as communications and engagement, digital and demand and capacity modelling</p> <p>7. How we will deliver this – provides the structure of governance of how the recovery plan and transformation programme will be delivered with key milestones. There is a clear plan on how the public, patients, employees, and other stakeholders will be engaged throughout this programme.</p>

This feedback will continue to be fed into appropriate service areas and by the autumn a comprehensive record of all

		<p>intelligence gathered will be brought together and shared across the Bromley system in order to inform further developments and improvements. This engagement work being undertaken by One Bromley partners, includes groups that are disproportionately impacted by Covid-19. It involves a range of methods of capturing feedback including surveys, telephone calls, on-line meetings etc.</p> <p>A public event was held on 27th August to provide an opportunity to explain our recovery plans to Bromley residents and to seek their feedback on a public summary of our recovery plan which will be published and distributed in September. The public summary will explain how we have responded to Covid-19, what will be different for them and how they can help local services by accessing care at the right time and from the right place. It will also include some questions to enable us to continue to capture their views and experiences.</p>
