1. Introductions



	JE welcome everyone to the meeting and informed attendees that Catherine Pearson from Healthwatch Lambeth was standing in for Folake Segun on this occasion.	
	JE explained that the order of the agenda will changed to ensure there is sufficient time to discuss the Covid-19 vaccination insight surveys.	
2.	Declarations of Interest	All

	All committee members must complete a Declaration of Interest (DoI) form. Three public members have so far completed their DoIs and everyone is encouraged to do so as soon as possible.	
3.	Minutes of the meeting held on	
	This is the first meeting of the Engagement Assurance Committee (EAC) so no prior meetings minutes.	
4.	Covid-19 insight report (RW)	
	RW shared some insights from research into people's attitudes towards the Covid-19 vaccine. Some of the key points include:	
	 Disparities amongst BAME communities and White ethnic groups in likelihood of accepting vaccines, with lower levels of trust from BAME communities vs White. Young people less likely than older people to accept vaccine. Many people receive their information from WhatsApp. People worry about unforeseen side effects from vaccine and that the vaccine is used for commercial profits. Information from GP and health professional and trusted sources may help to encourage people to accept the vaccine when offered. Transparency in information and communication important e.g., clarity on safety, efficacy, and vaccine schedule. 	
	Comments from committee:	
	Important not to proportion blame on certain groups as this will increase resistance and may impede social cohesion. Instead, we need to galvanise the community to come together so they feel part of the bigger picture.	
	Understanding history of why people may be hesitant to vaccinations is important to address concerns.	



Messaging to community about vaccinations needs to be clear and in plain English so that people can make informed decision.

The wider issue around inequalities for BAME communities, but also other vulnerable categories e.g., people with learning disability and autism, needs to be addressed.

5 Terms of Reference – for approval

RW explained that the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the EAC were produced as part of the task and finish groups in the summer of 2020. These will be reviewed again at 6 months and then every 12 months.

One question related to the EAC having a work plan and JE responded that the committee will have a work plan going forward but in the current climate, projects and focus change rapidly.

The committee **approved** the ToR and these will now be presented at the Governing Body (GB) meeting for ratification at the earliest opportunity. However, due to the pandemic, the GB is currently only reviewing urgent decisions.

6 Outcomes of task and finish groups

RW explained the background to the task and finish groups that were held from June – September 2020, as a continuation from the engagement work in January - March across south east London (SEL) as part of the merger to develop an engagement strategy for the new SEL CCG. This work was subsequently put on hold in March when the pandemic arrived and resumed in June 2020.

There were four task and finish groups:

- Engagement Assurance Committee
- Digital engagement
- Non-digital engagement
- Covid-19 impact

The digital and non-digital groups worked in parallel but came together to agree the principles for engagement. These principles have been formally agreed by the Governing Body in September 2020 and now informs the engagement work for the CCG. The principles are particularly important to ensure people are not excluded due to lack of digital access or ability.

RW asked people to share their thoughts on how we can engage with people who may be digitally excluded and some of the comments were:

	It was noted that any digital engagement platform needs to be be GDPR compliant.			
	The committee approved the recommendations of the task and finish groups with the above noted.
