	Questions raised at the meeting	
1	Please recognise the surgery based teams that have done great work - I call out London Lane - the paid staff and abundance of volunteers have made it work exceptionally well. Also, the vaccine recipients have been a pleasure to work with and that is where we should say thanks for their part.	Thank you for the positive feedback about our local vaccination services run by General Practice. We will be sure to pass on this feedback. The CCG is hugely grateful for the dedication and support from both staff and volunteers, who have been central to the success of the Bromley vaccination programme. We sent a small gift hamper to every vaccination site team as a thank you aligned with the NHS Birthday, and messages of thanks to the volunteers during National Volunteer Week recently. We have also sent our thanks to the public for playing their part through our newspaper advertorials and other communications.

2	Bromley has an excellent record of engaging with young people and families. Important this continues as services are redesigned/developed for them.	The Bromley health and care system remains committed to ensuring that young people and families continue to have a say in how services are designed and developed to meet their needs. It is critical that those who will use services are able to help shape what is delivered so that it will meet their needs. In previous years we have undertaken comprehensive work with children and young people to help design our local community mental health services. The CCG is also working with Bromley Council to engage children, young people and families on changes to speech and language and occupational therapy services in the borough. This work will inform the transformation of these services in the coming period.
3	Hospital at home - will you be seeking feedback from the families using the service?	Yes – experiences of using the Hospital at Home service are routinely captured and used to help inform what is on offer. So far the feedback captured has been very positive. We will continue to seek both families and staff feedback on the service and this is reviewed on a monthly basis.
4	Suggestion on frailty comments by Andrew and Harvey - any thoughts given to using the ad boards in Bromley town centre to have a daily suggestion of how to deal with the issues raised so that over 2-3 weeks, there is enough to engage interest and encourage discussion by a wider audience? Again, happy to discuss offline.	The ad boards in Bromley Town Centre are managed by Bromley Council. At the moment these are being used to get important information out to residents about their Covid-19 vaccination. Any further use of them would need to be discussed with the council.
5	What consideration is being given to taking vaccination teams into schools? I appreciate there are issues of governance of the delivery as well as permission from parents. These can be addressed, even if for a majority and not all. Going this route will tackle the concerns over youth spreading. Thanks - though my point is can something be done in the very near future. Happy to discuss further offline after call.	<p>In relation to your suggestion about taking teams to schools for vaccinating children, I think this is a very good idea and something we have been doing with other vaccines in the past.</p> <p>However, there has not yet been a decision nationally to vaccinate children but, if that is agreed, I am sure that one of the models will be to vaccinate children in schools.</p>
6	Please could you give an update on the progress of the Bromley Health and Well Being Centre.	The CCG is continuing to develop the requirements for the outline business case for the scheme for submission later this year. An update will be brought to the Borough Based Board when this is ready. We are also continuing to work closely with the London Borough of Bromley in progressing the development of the preferred option on the Civic Centre site.
