Executive Summary	<p>Discussions held between the CCG and LBB earlier this year identified a need to give greater priority to developing services to children and young people with a focus on the interface between children’s health, education and social care service.</p> <p>In support of this priority the CCG has appointed an Interim Associate Director for Children and Young People’s Integrated Commissioning to lead on this work.</p> <p>This report makes recommendations on the children and young people work priorities that will be led through this post.
