Title	Developing an Integrated Frailty model for Bromley

Executive Summary	<p>A Frailty Task Group was set up at Princess Royal University Hospital, to develop a proposal for a 'World Class' Frailty Service.</p> <p>The findings have been presented at the One Bromley Frailty Task & Finish group and via individual partner engagement. The vision and principles were agreed but acknowledged this needs to be an integrated model and input from all One Bromley partners.</p> <p>The model is centered around the needs of patients with frailty ensuring they are cared for in the most appropriate setting. This system wide integrated frailty model is looking at frailty across:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Proactive care (self-management & anticipatory care) • Urgent community response to crisis • Acute care <p>The service will have a defined set of patients centered principles covering:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Early identification and support of frailty across the system • Comprehensive Geriatric Assessment and anticipatory management plans • Moving the 'front door' of frailty to community (i.e., providing same day frailty ambulatory services and direct access to community care) • Multidisciplinary teams providing an integrated service through One Bromley • Admissions avoidance • Improved share care records • Robust governance • Focus on research, training, education and data. <p>The presentation is to outline the vision, principles and progress of the developing integrated frailty model.</p>
