<p>Question 1</p> <p>Chair, Albion Street Practice Patient Participation Group</p>	<p>In the Borough Directors Report May 2021 under Item 4 – Estates Update. Canada Water and Elephant and Castle it states: “We are in discussion with the developers at Canada Water and Elephant and Castle to create much needed new clinical facilities for these areas. Planning applications for the sites will be made shortly.” In the Borough Directors Report July 2021 there is no Estates Update. Could you please give an update, in particular to the Canada Water Site?</p> <p>As the Chair of Albion Street Group Practice PPG the last we were informed was that Albion Street Group Practice were to relocate to the New Site. At the North Southwark PPG meeting March 2020 we were told that the site would be where the Old Rotherhithe Police Station was on Lower Road SE16. We have not had any further communication, but as a new planning application is being made, why have we not been informed? Also why have local stakeholders not been involved in planning this?</p>
<p>Response</p>	<p>The developer for Canada Water and Elephant and Castle has approached the CCG to provide an initial brief for the health elements. This will enable the developer to submit an outline planning application for the development. It is proposed to put the health hub on the 'Decathlon Site'. This development is in the early stages and the current expectation is for the building to be delivered in approximately five years. We will be engaging further with local stakeholders to develop the scheme.</p>
