	Questions raised at the meeting	
1	Private organisations were used to support ICS developmental work. To what extent is this reflected in the ICS approach to be adopted.	<p>Response from Ben Collins, SEL ICS Director of System Development</p> <p>Two social enterprise external consultancies were commissioned to facilitate support SEL CCG in its vision and design work because of their considerable experience in their respective fields. The nature of the ICS shall be within the national framework for ICSs and implementation shall be driven by relevant health and social care partners.</p>
2	Which organisations shall sit on the SEL ICS Partnership Board and what shall be their responsibilities? Will there still be local pay and conditions or will this be subject to a national agreement.	<p>Response from Ben Collins, SEL ICS Director of System Development</p> <p>The CCG shall be replaced by an ICS Partnership Board which will require changes to current governance structures. In the new set-up, governance shall centre around partnerships across health and care systems so that partners can make decisions collectively in relation to health and care services, though sovereign organisations shall retain their own statutory obligations and decision-making apparatus.</p> <p>There has been no literature to suggest any changes to pay or conditions.</p>
3	When the Borough Based Board is dissolved as part of the transition to the SEL ICS being a statutory body, what will be the nature of public engagement in local decision-making forums given that the Healthier Greenwich Alliance does not hold its meetings in public?	<p>Response from Neil Kennett-Brown, Greenwich Borough Director, SEL CCG</p> <p>As part of the ICS, the Greenwich Borough Based Board shall be dissolved though there shall continue to be a framework in which there is a delegation of responsibilities, though rather than from a CCG Governing Body it shall be from the ICS Partnership Board, and likely to the Greenwich Local Care Partnership (LCP). The exact name and form of the LCP is now yet known.</p>
4	What is meant by the term 'package' within the description of the Clinical Effectiveness Programme'.	<p>Response from Sabah Salman, SEL CCG Governing Body for Greenwich</p> <p>It refers to the package of support, guidance and templates to be provided to clinicians.</p>

5	<p>Is any information available on plans for the Tewson Road site? There has been discussion of construction of a block of flats, which would not be the best use of space for the community. A detailed public consultation on options should be launched.</p>	<p>Response from Malcolm Brydon, Estates Lead for Greenwich and Bexley, SEL CCG</p> <p>The CCG has commissioned a feasibility study/options appraisal for the future use/potential use of the Plumstead Health Centre, with the main focus being upon the potential to develop a new multi-use primary health care centre. The study will include a wider review of the site and try to determine if there are other uses which could be accommodated on the site.</p>
